Lloyd Street Designated Device Program (DDP) `Snapshot' summary

- Extra year of school use, almost the same cost, same designated device, different payment structure
- Extend the existing designated device program for yr 5 and 6 to include a device for year 4 students
- Purchase by parents via LWT portal for \$770 as one off payment, layby, or 6/12 month payment plan
- Increased personalised learning, student ownership, confidence, and improved outcomes
- Structured Cyber Safety program supports safe and responsible technology use
- Stronger connection to learning at home and school through use of Google Suite
- More effective link to the IB and PYP networks across the globe
- School currently operates the laptop program at a loss every year which is unsustainable.
- Includes hardware, OS, and software. 3 year full onsite warranty, insurance and tech support
- Donation option at end of 3 years to allow other families needing support access to a device



We have payment options to minimise the impact and the option of 2nd hand school devices for loan.



Educational benefits of Designated Device Program

- Authentic collaboration, innovation, creation and publication opportunities beyond the traditional classroom
- Allows students to gain access to a personalised and continually growing bank of educational content
- Supports teachers to expand their programs using high-quality content to meet the needs of students
- Better equips students with the skills for future learning including independent and responsible technology use
- Provides 1:1 access to learning and assessment tools i.e. Google classroom, Essential Assessment
- Increases digital literacy in research, coding, content, data creation and organisation
- Engages and encourages students, and boosts confidence and learning outcomes
- Greater connection to student learning for parents with access to lessons and content via Google Suite
- Using the same devices allows the technical management and support to be effective and efficient

How do we ensure safe and responsible use?

- Updated Whole School Acceptable Use and Designated Device Acceptable Use Agreements
 - A set of explicit expectations, rules and consequences for students to follow
 - Classroom teachers will provide opportunities for students to read, discuss and sign agreements
- Cyber Safety
 - Department of Education Edustar firewall limits and monitors all internet access at school
 - Ongoing cyber safety reminders and support during learning time
 - 'Cyber Safety Project' explicit sessions: 1 session per term
- Digital Technology lessons
 - Lessons planned around digital regarding safe and ethical practices
- Ongoing tech support and device monitoring



- Lloyd St IT technician onsite to provide support and network safety



What will Digital Technologies look like at Lloyd Street?

The four core areas that encompass the Digital Technologies curriculum are:

• Digital Responsibility, Communication and Collaboration, Creating Digitally and Investigating and Problem Solving.

Some of the opportunities provided through the program now and into the future include:

- **Content Creation** Creating digital books, recording podcasts, filming adverts, web design, 3D modelling and printing
- Coding Programming Lego robotics, Sphero, Micro:bits to solve real-world problems.
 Game development on different applications. 3D design and VR in the future
- Online Collaboration and Communication Students co-create using online platforms, digitally represent data, and explain understanding using multimedia, engage in global PYP connections
